## SUMMARIZING YOUR SENSE OF JOHN'S REVELATION OF THE CHRIST'S RETURN

Studying Scripture can be a labor of love, or a labor of tears. Revealing the Revealings of John in Revelation has been both. We have learned about the beauty of God's caring; we have learned about the wrath God exacts for evil. We have seen the Christ tell His called out that some are a synagogue of Satan, and others are so lukewarm in their faith, He wants to spit them out. We have seen the Christ love on the called out—He invites them to come, to drink freely of the tree of life.

Yet, down deep, the study of Scripture resides within the heart, your heart. As said in the beginning of this study—
